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## 2.0 Receival Fees

The receival fees apply to all tonnes delivered into GrainCorp's Storages from either ex-grower or from sources external to GrainCorp. The receival fee is calculated on the receival tonnage as recorded on the receival dockets, prior to the deduction for shrinkage.

### 2.1 Services included in the receival fee

The services included in the receival fee are as follows:

- Receival into GrainCorp Storage ex-grower or from sources external to GrainCorp during the hours and days specified by GrainCorp;
- Sampling and classification on delivery;
- Testing services;
- Weighing on delivery;
- Recording and provision of delivery information on Receival Dockets;
- Grain segregation as per harvest plan;
- Insurance for all general physical risk (ie. fire, flood, storm etc.)
- Wheat quality surveillance (wheat receival fees only).

### 2.2 Standard and Special Grades

For the purposes of charging for segregations, grades have been classified into standard and special grades. Standard Grades are all grades identified to be received by GrainCorp in the pre-harvest segregation plan. *Special Grades* refer to noodle and soft wheat segregations and other specific grades requested before or during the harvest period that are agreed between the customer and GrainCorp prior to implementation.

### 2.3 Durum Grades

All durum receivals will be assessed using the Cervitec digital analyser for determining vitreous kernel. The pricing differential has been necessitated by the cost of the digital imaging equipment.



## 2.4 Wheat Quality Surveillance

Wheat Quality Surveillance includes provision of comprehensive and up to date harvest quality information based on running sample data information analysed in GrainCorp NATA certified labs. It also covers provision of test milling and animal nutrition data at early harvest and harvest completion on a port zone basis.

Wheat Quality Surveillance also funds research and development programs including provision of samples to researchers, and Grower Declaration auditing including pesticide residue status and varietal declarations.

Reasonable sample notification requirements obtained prior to harvest and collected during intake are included in the fee. NB: Additional sample requests in excess of 5kg/site will be charged at \$50/kg.

Harvest data and samples will be provided on a site/grade and/or port zone basis where customers own stock. The port zone codes, site lists and forms for registering for samples and data are available by contacting [gcsamples@graincorp.com.au](mailto:gcsamples@graincorp.com.au).

### 2.4.1 Sample Collection

GrainCorp will collect and compile on a best endeavours basis, the following composite samples for analysis.

1. Site by Grade composite samples (SGCS) – all GrainCorp sites receiving wheat
2. Port zone by Grade composite samples (ZPCS, ZFCS).

Preliminary port zone composite samples (ZPCS) are to represent approximately 20% of expected harvest receivals. Final port zone composite samples (ZFCS) are to represent at least 80% of expected harvest receivals.

Note that Non Milling port zone grades have not been designated for milling testing, only for nutritional analysis. If received in sufficient quantity, testing and provision of milling results may be available to marketers.

Specific milling and baking on other quality testing can be provided on a fee for service basis.

### 2.4.2 Sample Analysis - Tests Conducted

The following tests will be conducted on samples delivered from receipt sites for analysis.

1. Site by Grade composite samples  
Moisture, protein, screenings, test weight, unmillable material, falling number, grain defects, grain contaminants.
2. Port Zone by Grade composite samples (milling grades)

Wheat grain – test weight, thousand kernel weight, grain hardness, protein, moisture, wheat ash, falling number, screenings, US dockage, foreign material, flour extraction

Wheat flour – protein, wet gluten, colour grade, diastatic activity, ash, sedimentation volume, Minolta Colour I value a value b value, farinogram, extensogram, alveograph (P,L,W, configuration ratio), viscogram (peak viscosity, gelatinisation temperature, time and breakdown)



Animal nutrition – dry matter, crude protein, digestibility, energy and acid detergent fibre.

End product – Straight dough baking test, sponge and dough baking test, yellow alkaline noodle test (Noodle grades).

### **2.4.3 Supply of Analysis Data**

1. Site by grade composite sample results  
GrainCorp will supply results of site by grade samples representative of all receivals to date on a twice weekly (Tuesday and Friday) basis until 90% of the expected tonnage is received.
2. Port zone by grade composite samples  
GrainCorp will supply preliminary port zone by grade composite sample results as described in this document will be made available progressively as available. These results will be posted on GrainCorp's website on or before this date.

Final port zone by grade composite sample results as described in this document will be supplied progressively as available. Final reporting is expected by March 31, 2010

### **2.4.4 Supply of Additional Samples**

Samples will only be provided where customers have ownership on a site/grade grade/port zone. Companies requiring additional samples during the harvest period will need to supply a list of their needs to GrainCorp's Technical Services and Quality Division by October 15 by contacting [gcsamples@graincorp.com.au](mailto:gcsamples@graincorp.com.au) for the required format. These may be supplied and dispatched free of any additional charges (excluding courier costs), providing they have already been compiled and those samples are available for distribution. Sample requests in excess of 5kg site/grade or 20kg grade/port zone will be charged at \$50/kg.

Samples which have not been compiled during the harvest period, or have been requested less than 4 weeks before the harvest commences may incur a separate and substantial charge based on POA.

1. Sample Labelling  
Unless advised to the contrary, additional samples will be labelled with the following details  
  
Sample type, port zone, site (if applicable) variety (if applicable) grade, season, date collected.
2. Sample Dispatch and Courier Costs  
GrainCorp will dispatch additional samples using the courier nominated by individual marketers at their own cost at off peak rates. Thus, an account number and con-notes will be required. Alternatively, marketers can arrange for their preferred courier to collect from GrainCorp by completing their own con-note details.



## 2.5 Malt Barley Germination Management System

Malt Grades fee includes the “Malt Barley Germination Management System” (MBGMS) service.

MBGMS is a method of managing malt barley germinations through the provision of a report to the Client based on ‘Predictive Modeling’ that identifies outturn priorities. GrainCorp will endeavour to provide this information to customers to give anticipated notice in advance. As part of this service GrainCorp will provide:

- (a) predictive modeling and advice to customers on expected shelf-life timeframes in order to aid logistics and sales;
- (b) increased use of silos and sheds for storage and the adoption of fan aeration on stock where possible. The aim will be to balance bunker use for malt barley with storage plans that maximise pesticide residue free barley and management of insect resistance. Where bunkers are used, a system of priority out-turns will be in operation in consultation with all co-owners;
- (c) a focus for Operations staff training related to post-harvest management and awareness of germinations;
- (d) a Malt Barley Germination Management System Quality Committee responsible for: (i) identifying priority outturn sites and advising all malt clients of recommended outturn timeframes, (ii) addressing operations equipment needs such as temperature monitoring, aeration fan use etc and (iii) identifying storage research needs and allocating budgeting;
- (e) a “Yellow Flag” report to the Customer based on ‘Predictive Modeling’ that identifies outturn priorities. GrainCorp will endeavour to provide this information to customers to give anticipated notice in advance. As part of this service GrainCorp will:
  - 1. give at least one month’s notice of site grade stock that may be considered to be at risk of failing to outturn at minimum 95% germination; and
  - 2. draw post-harvest samples of malting barley stocks and provide germination reports to the customer on a regular basis from February – October.

Storage fees apply on all accounting stock tonnes commencing on the first day of the month immediately after receipt and at all Sites. The fee will be calculated on the "shrunk" tonnes (refer to the Country Storage and Handling Agreement for further information on "Shrink"). The fee will continue to be charged to the customer on the opening balance of the Accounting Stock tonnes on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month until outloaded from GrainCorp Storage or a Port Terminal (refer Bulk Wheat Port Terminal Services Agreement and Bulk Grain Port Terminal Services Agreement for the relevant storage fees at those locations).

#### 3.1 Services included in the Storage Fee

The services provided in the storage fees are as follows:

- Maintenance and provision (including electronically) of grain stock records by site and grade;
- Pesticide and fumigation application as required during the storage period;
- Condition monitoring, including aeration and temperature monitoring of canola;
- Provision of web based information regarding grain accessibility.

Additional services for aerating storages and temperature monitoring are available and may be subject to additional fees.

### 4.2 Country Outloading to Container

Country outloading to containers includes:

1. Outloading to GrainCorp Packing sites (Brisbane, Sunshine and Geelong)
2. Outloading to non GrainCorp packing sites
3. Outloading to containers to be packed at an accredited GrainCorp site by GrainCorp
4. Outloading to containers to be packed by an approved mobile packer on an accredited GrainCorp site
5. Prices in table below do NOT include container packing fees

When outloading to containers, GrainCorp will meet the minimum standard grade receival specifications.

Extended hours of outloading to rail (eg. 24 hour loading plus weekends and public holidays) are available upon request but subject to labour availability.



### 4.3 Services included in the Outloading Fee

Services included in the outloading fee are as follows:

1. Loading of rail wagons (at sites on rail) during normal hours of operation, as advised by GrainCorp from time to time;
2. Loading of road vehicles, at sites where road outloading is available, during normal hours of operation, as advised by GrainCorp from time to time.

The outloading fee is calculated on the outloading tonnage. The rail and road outloading fee will be payable on the following activities:

- a) Rail outloading to or on behalf of the customer or to GrainCorp Packing Facilities or Port Terminal by rail transport from the country site;
- b) Road outloading to or on behalf of the customer or the ContainerLink or Port Terminal by road transport from a country site.

Where grain is moved from one GrainCorp Storage to another by road transport the difference between the road and rail outloading fee (where there is a differential) is payable on the tonnage outloaded to the other country site and the rail outloading fee is payable on grain outloaded to the customer or to GrainCorp Packing Facilities or Port Terminal by rail transport from the other GrainCorp Storage; and

Where grain is moved from one GrainCorp Storage to another for the purposes of consolidation or elevation to rail, only the final journey to GrainCorp Packing Facilities or Port Terminal or domestic end-user will be charged where no differential exists between the outloading rate of the originating GrainCorp Storage and the destination GrainCorp Storage however transshipment fees may apply (refer to Transshipment Schedule for Tariff Rates or contact your GrainCorp Business Manager for a quote).

Services excluded in the rail outloading fee include:

1. Procurement of rail and road transport service providers

### 4.4 Order Notification Requirements

Minimum notification periods are required for road outloading. Failure to meet these order requirements may lead to outload delays. Orders may not be processed if received after the cut-off times outlined below.

- a) At primary sites, all outloading requests must be received prior to 3pm on the business day before the outload date requested. No minimum order tonnage limitations are applicable however outloading request is subject to the grade being shown as available on the *Grain Availability Sheet* of the current week.
- b) At non-primary silos, all outloading requests must be received prior to 3pm two business days prior to the outload date requested. No minimum order tonnage limitations are applicable however outloading request is subject to the grade being shown as available on the *Grain Availability Sheet* of the current week. Where the grade is shown as 'by arrangement', outloading will be subject to labour availability.

It is the customer's responsibility to ensure that road transport providers advise GrainCorp of vehicle registration details by 5pm the day prior to outloading unless using the GrainCorp web truck booking program where registration bookings can be made up to 6:00am on the day of outloading. An estimated time of arrival is required for each truck registration.



For additional security purposes, GrainCorp requires the customer to provide destination details for all road outturns to the domestic market.

It is a requirement for road transport operators to maintain direct contact with the outload site on the day prior and the actual day of outload for final confirmation of arrival time. A road carrier must be able to quote the appropriate GSO number and destination to the site operator upon arrival for grain security reasons. Failure to contact the site may lead to delays, as cancellation staff may not be available. A contact list for sites is available on the GrainCorp web page.

The list of Primary Sites and Major sites (subject to change) is attached as Appendix 1.

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## 5.0. GrainCorp Technical Services Fees

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### 5.1 Treatment/Fumigation Certificate Fees

The cost for a Treatment /Fumigation Certificate is \$100 for the first Certificate and \$40 per Certificate for any subsequent issue of Certificates requested relating to that cargo.

- Fees include the distribution as required via post (including Express Post), email or fax



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## 6.0 Miscellaneous Charges

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### 6.1 Pesticide Residue Free Grain

Pesticide Residue Free (PRF) grain is grain that has not been treated by GrainCorp with a contact pesticide. GrainCorp is not responsible for PRF grain that has been accepted into the GrainCorp storage and handling system from other bulk handling companies, private storage or from growers as GrainCorp does not test on receipt for the presence of prior treatments. Nor is GrainCorp responsible for prior treatments or contamination from storage, handling or transport equipment. PRF grain is supplied to the market via common grain paths, elevators, conveyors, silos, road/rail trucks etc which have the capacity to transfer low levels of contamination of pesticides. Please refer to the relevant clauses in GrainCorp's Storage and Handling Agreement.

Pesticide Residue Free Grain		Fee / T
Payable on all grain shipped as PRF		\$1.10

This is applicable where grain is requested by the customer, **and agreed by GrainCorp**, to be shipped in bulk or containerised as pesticide residue free to either the domestic or export market. Payable on all grain required to be shipped as PRF.

- PRF grain requests require a minimum of four weeks notice;
- GrainCorp does not guarantee PRF grain nor accept any liability for grain not meeting PRF requirements;
- GrainCorp can only review the hygiene history for grain held in GrainCorp storages;
- PRF requests must be stated clearly on all enquiries, packing instructions, Grain Stock Orders and Cargo Nomination Applications;
- The fee covers site selection and arrangement of samples and arrangement of tests;
- PRF testing for bulk shipments is included in the fee above;
- PRF testing for bulk shipments does not include rapid tests and is at the shipper's expense;
- PRF testing for containers is at the shipper's expense;
- PRF results are usually only available after the vessel has sailed;
- If the grain is found to exceed maximum residue levels at the destination, GrainCorp will refund the fee of \$1.10 per tonne but accepts no liability.



## 6.2 Pesticide Residue Restricted Grain

Pesticide Residue Restricted (PRR) grain is grain that is selected, tested and outturned to a pesticide level which varies from the maximum residue limits prescribed for the commodity by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) and Food Standards Australian & New Zealand (FSANZ). GrainCorp is not responsible for ensuring pesticide restricted grain meets specified residue tolerances where the commodity has been accepted into the GrainCorp storage and handling system from other bulk handling companies, private storage or from growers as GrainCorp cannot have knowledge of nor be responsible for prior treatments or contamination from storage, handling or transport equipment.

Pesticide restricted grain is supplied to the market via common grain paths, elevators, conveyors, silos, road/rail trucks etc which have the capacity to transfer low levels of contamination of pesticides. Please refer to the relevant clauses in GrainCorp's Country Storage and Handling Agreement.

This is applicable where grain is requested by the customer, **and agreed by GrainCorp**, to be shipped in bulk or containerised as pesticide residue restricted grain to either the domestic or export market. Payable on all grain required to be shipped as PRR.

- PRR grain requests require a minimum of four weeks notice;
- GrainCorp does not guarantee PRR grain or accept any liability for grain not meeting PRR requirements;
- GrainCorp can only review a the hygiene history for grain held in GrainCorp storages;
- PRR requests must be stated clearly on all enquiries, packing instructions, Grain Stock Orders and Cargo Nomination Applications;
- The fee covers site selection and arrangement of samples and arrangement of tests;
- PRR testing for bulk shipments is included in the fee above;
- PRR testing for bulk shipments does not include rapid tests and is at the shipper's expense;
- PRR testing for containers is at the shipper's expense;
- PRR results are normally only available after the vessel has sailed;
- If the grain is found to exceed maximum residue levels at the destination, GrainCorp will refund the fee of \$1.10 per tonne but accepts no liability.

## 6.3 Branchline Throughput Fee

#### 6.4 Re-Delivery Fee

This fee is applicable to grain outloaded from GrainCorp's sites and rejected at its destination for reasons outside of the control of GrainCorp and tendered for re-delivery to GrainCorp storage. This fee applies to all sites and will be applied at the discretion of GrainCorp. This fee will apply if grain is rejected at a destination for quality non conformance and subsequent load samples indicate that the load is within specification.
